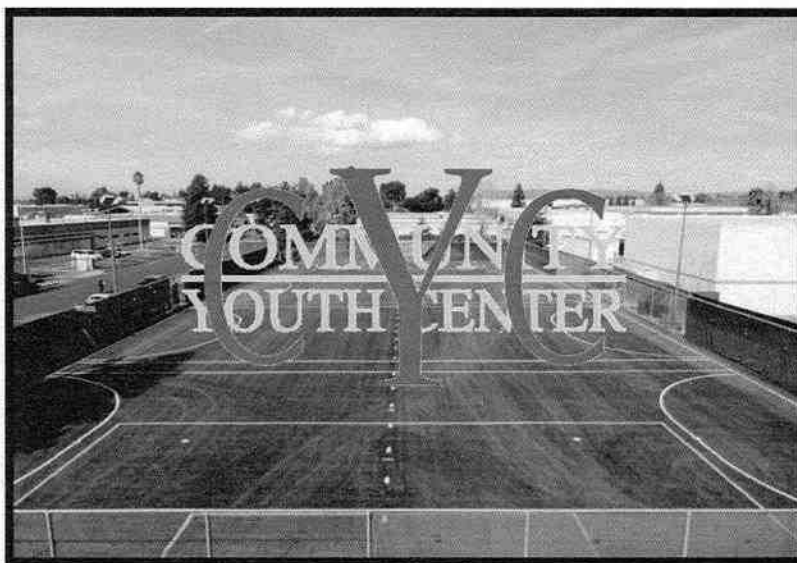

COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP

Any conversation about what makes Clayton Valley High School a great school will inevitably lead to a list of accolades about Steve and Debra Gonsalves. Inevitably it will become an infinite list that no one can finish because it is impossible to number or even describe the numerous projects and events that Debra and Steve have taken part in or to which they have made generous donations.

Debra and Steve have always had hearts of gold and their legacy with Clayton Valley High School dates back to their high school years, a time that Debra describes as the best years of her life. Debra was a cheerleader and teaching assistant to Dee Billeter. Dee exclaimed that Debra's willingness to help was evident even as a young girl. Her amazing energy and positive attitude were contagious. All of the younger PE students loved her. Steve was a hot shot on the basketball courts playing varsity for three years, earning first team all league two years in a row. He stills holds the Clayton Valley record for most rebounds. Steve also played golf and football, so he was a very busy guy. But not too busy to stop him from finding his high school sweetheart Debra! Steve graduated in '71 followed by Debra in '72. They married in 1977 and have two beautiful daughters who followed in their footsteps, graduating from Clayton Valley - Kelli in '01 and Jennifer in '04.

When it comes to lending a helping hand, no cause is too big or too small for the Gonsalves. They have spent their lives helping others and improving our community. Besides their alma mater they have made significant contributions to dozens of schools, such as Mt Diablo Elementary, Highlands Elementary, Tabernacle Christian, Diablo View, Pine Hollow, De La Salle, Carondelet, and Pittsburg High, just to name a few.



Their philanthropy knows no bounds, Steve is a member of the CYC Board and makes annual donations as he advocates for others to do the same. Steve and Debra are significant annual donors to We Care Child Services and many other organizations that help less fortunate individuals and families. When Steve heard that sports were being eliminated in our school district, he was the first one to step up to make a substantial donation. Then he called on others to do the same. There are an abundance of reasons that the CV football stadium is named after Steve and Debra. Just about everything in it can be attributed to their generous donations, including the press box, lights, and the track and field. Steve did not just hand over a check; he dug in and joined the committee to drive the stadium project to completion. Currently, he is once more helping with the stadium's further renovation.

Debra's interest in helping also reaches far and wide, but it is clear her focus is still Clayton Valley where she has left her mark in the classroom as well as on the campus. Debra is well known as the Queen of Campus Beautification at the school. She is often seen planting flowers, cleaning gutters, mowing fields, etc. For Debra it is a labor of love. She has worked in classrooms, counseling troubled girls and encouraging special education students to set goals for the future. She helped spearhead the "Do the Right Thing" program at Clayton Valley, worked closely with the Parent Faculty Club and Athletic Boosters, and every year helps with the "Every 15 Minutes" program. You will often see Debra and Steve on the football sidelines and in the baseball bleachers cheering on the CV athletic teams.

These two remarkable people have won the hearts of the entire community. A friend of theirs wrote this poem, which is memorialized at Gonsalves Stadium:

To share some of what you have accomplished with the next generation is admirable, to truly care about that generation is noble. This stadium is dedicated to Steve and Debra Gonsalves, alumni of Clayton Valley High School for their unwavering commitment to improving this high school. Their generosity, their wisdom, and their personal caring have made Clayton Valley High School Campus a better place for the generations of students to follow.

TOM DIMERCURIO

BASEBALL, FOOTBALL, TENNIS, GYMNASTICS



Tom DiMercurio's excellent athletic ability was apparent at an early age while he was growing up in Pittsburg, California. He competed in football, baseball, basketball and track at Pittsburg High School and was All-League in both football and basketball his junior and senior years. Tom was inducted into the Pittsburg High School Hall of Fame in 1998.

He continued his education at Humboldt State College where he played football and baseball. He was named to the All-Far Western Conference Baseball Team in 1963 and 1964.

Tom began teaching and coaching at Clayton Valley High School in 1965. His first year, he coached J.V. football with Larry Fogelstrom and the team won the DVAL championship. Tom moved up to the varsity and was an assistant to Pete Carpino and later Roger Zino from 1967 to 1974. Tom was the backfield coach on the 1974 Ugly Eagles team which won the first DVAL football championship for Clayton Valley and also won the famous Turkey Bowl. Tom was inducted into the Clayton Valley Hall of Fame with the team in 2010.

He was the varsity baseball coach at Clayton Valley from 1966 to 1979. His 1977 team, dubbed, "the Space Eagles", won the league championship and the North Coast Section Inland Valley Championship. This team will be inducted into the Clayton Valley Hall of Fame tonight with Tom.

Tom was selected as the Fitzpatrick Chevrolet Baseball Coach of the Year in 1970 and again in 1977. He was well-respected by his athletes and fellow coaches in the Bay Area for his skill and knowledge. Tom always had great rapport with his students and athletes.

Herc Pardi, who played both football and baseball under DiMercurio says "Coach was and always will be one of our most well-liked and respected coaches at CVHS. You wanted to play hard for him and your teammates".

Tom has always been generous with his time and talent. Over the years, he worked with the late Jerry Coakley to put on youth baseball clinics. After retiring from baseball, he stepped up to fill vacancies in the Clayton Valley athletic program and coached the boy's gymnastics team and later the boys tennis team. Tom is still sharing his skills as he teaches tennis and puts on bocce ball clinics in his retirement community. Next on his agenda there is to teach a dance class.



Tom retired from teaching at Clayton Valley in 1997. He and his wife Patti have been married for 52 years and live at Trilogy in Brentwood. Their family includes sons Jeff and Joe, daughter-in law Becky and grandchildren Marco and Cara.

Congratulations to Tom for his long dedication to Clayton Valley and its athletes and his second induction into the Clayton Valley Hall of Fame!

JOHN MILLAR

COACH - TRACK, CROSS COUNTRY, SOCCER



When John Millar retired from coaching at Clayton Valley High School, he left an unmatched legacy of excellence. Among his accolades, he holds the head coaching record for Most Consecutive League Championships (8) in any sport at Clayton Valley.

John had boundless energy and enthusiasm as well as the ability to inspire athletes and students of all skill levels. Every class or team profited from his broad and unique education.

Millar grew up in Sacramento and went to Lewis and Clark College where he received his BA degree in History and Philosophy. He then attended the University of Athens in Athens, Greece studying Ancient History and Philosophy. After his stay in Greece he attended the University of St. Andrews in Scotland for one year and then went to the University of Tubingen in Germany studying medieval History and Theology. Millar went on to receive Masters degrees from San Francisco Theological Seminary in Theology, the GTU at UC Berkeley in Biblical Studies and finally at Sonoma State in US History. All this before he started teaching and years before his coaching career started.

Millar was hired to teach history in the MDUSD in 1972. He loved teaching history and having "Great Political Discussions" with his students. "I have no regrets about being a teacher. I liked it a lot but coaching track was the icing on the cake."

During the 15 years as track and field coach at Clayton Valley High School the program had tremendous success and growth. More than 100 uniformed athletes participated in the track and field program each year. There were some years three buses were needed to transport the team to league meets. Millar's philosophy was simple, make track and field fun, everyone is welcome, and encourage personal goals and surround the athletes with great assistant coaches. This philosophy worked as during his 15 years as head coach the girls team won 9 league championships, eight in a row, 89-96, and had a dual meet win-loss record of 107 wins and 14 losses. The Boys team was undefeated for three years, 94, 95, 96 and won league championships during those years. The boys record in dual meet competition was 96 wins and 25 losses.

Besides coaching track for 15 years he was the head girls soccer coach in 1988, a team that won the league championship, and was also the assistant cross country coach from 83 to 96. During those years the cross country teams, girls and boys, won many league and NCS championships, a State Championship and National recognition.

In 1996 Millar was selected as Northern California Track and Field Honor Coach.

John retired from teaching in 2003. He and his wife Marsha have been married for 46 years and live in Clayton. Their 3 children are all CVHS graduates. They have been blessed with 6 grandchildren.

Tonight, we congratulate John on his most well-deserved induction into the Clayton Valley High School Hall of Fame!

An excellent defense was led by standouts, Cory Whittaker, Matt Enemark, Bob Jordan, Randy Brown and Mitch Buich. Dennis Quinlan was the ace of the pitching staff at 10-3. Rich Villadao was 4-0 and came on strong in the playoffs and at North Coast Sectionals. Team Captain, Gene Wall was 4-4 and closer Kevin McKean saved 5 games and also did a great job as the 3rd base coach.

The Eagles beat De La Salle 14-13 and Alhambra 12-10 after trailing in both games to win the NCS Inland Valley Division Championship. At the 10th annual Fitzpatrick Super Sports Banquet Mitch Buich was named baseball Athlete of the Year and Tom DiMercurio was Coach of the Year.

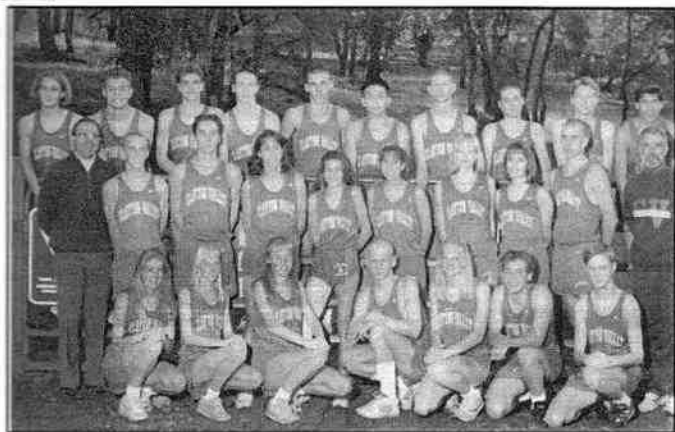

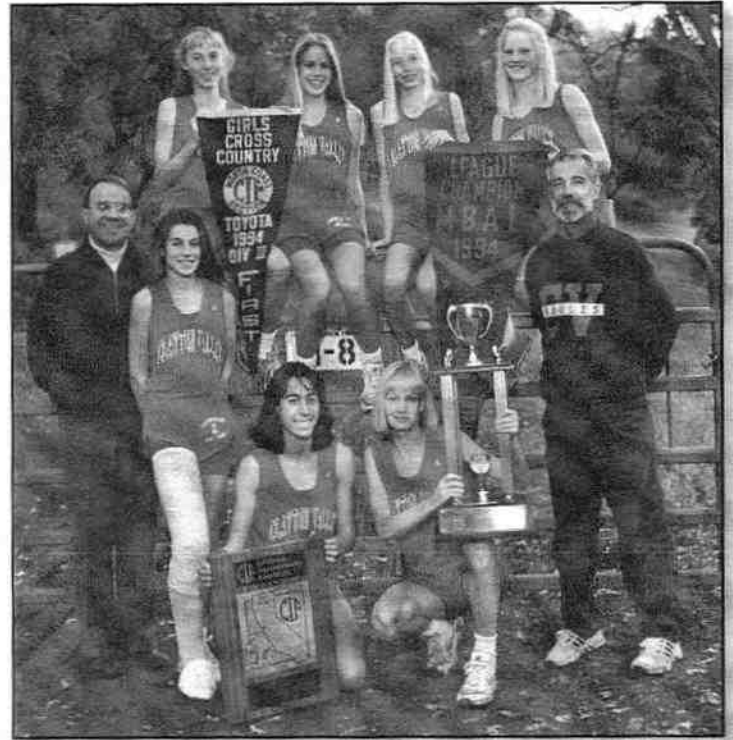
Mount San Antonio College Invitational Division III Sweepstakes Champions

This meet is the largest Invitational in California with 370 teams and 7500 competitors. Elite teams must be invited to compete in the Sweepstakes. The Eagles scored 63. A Los Angeles newspaper reported, "Clayton Valley had a blistering team time of 95 minutes and 13 seconds to easily win the 19 team race, Temescal Canyon (103) was a distant second." In the college divisions of this meet the men's and women's scores are combined to determine the winner. If they had done that with the high school division, Clayton Valley would still have won with three of our boys in the top ten including Mike Wojciechowski with a first place time of 16:17.

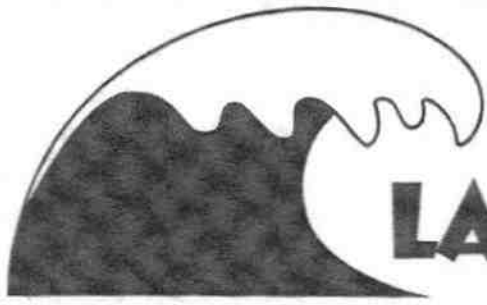

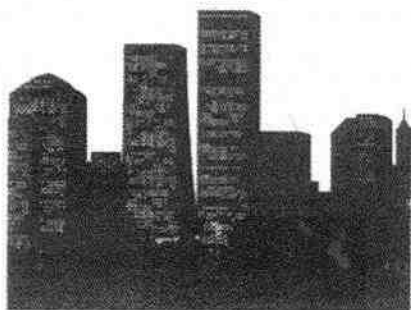

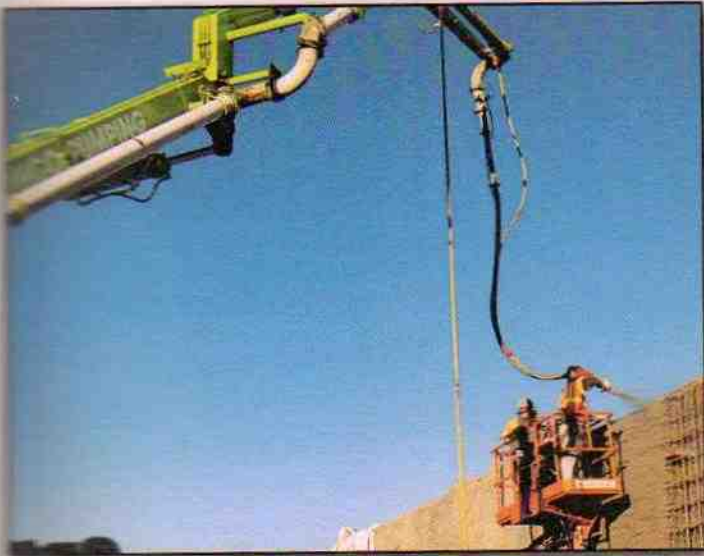
