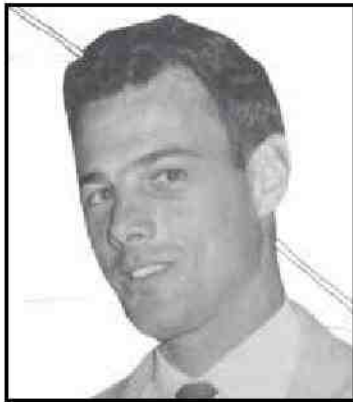

# MATT MAZZEI

## COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP

The Mazzei family is synonymous with GENEROSITY. From the time Lamar "Slats" Mazzei bought a car dealership in 1953 in Pittsburg and relocated in Antioch in 1963, many schools and youth programs have benefited for close to six decades. Pittsburg Jr. Baseball, Antioch Little League, Pittsburg Swim Club, the Pittsburg Theater Company, Pittsburg High School, Antioch High School and Adult sports teams flourished because of Mazzei Pontiac Cadillac.

The Mazzei Family moved to Clayton in 1959 and Mr. and Mrs. Mazzei immediately began to assist the community. Mrs. Mazzei volunteered at St. Bonaventure Church and for the Clayton Valley Women's Club. An annual Camelia Tea continues today in her honor. In the spring of 1964 Merrill McCarty started the Clayton Valley Little League with the help of an enthusiastic group of parents. Mr. Mazzei led the community charge by writing the first Team Sponsorship check. My brother Johnny and I were lucky to play on this team – the Major Cardinals. Every game Mr. Mazzei attended – which was many because of his love for baseball; a deal was in place with our manager – my father. If we won the game, then our team was treated to a hot dog and a Coke...all the way to our championship. For years Mr. Mazzei sponsored CVLL and other youth programs.

His son Matt followed siblings Mike '64 and Chris '66 to CVHS. Matt attended many extracurricular and athletic events prior to high school. Chris actually kept score for '65 and '66 Eagles Wrestling Teams and Coach Zino. Matt, a 1971 graduate, played football, basketball and baseball and sang in the concert choir. He worked at the dealership from an early age through high school to learn the business, and began selling cars after graduation. An early example of Matt's community support was in 1974. I started the St. Bonaventure CYO Track Team and Matt attended our first meet at CVHS to watch my 5th grade brother Dino sprint. The 2nd through 8th grade boys ran in basketball uniforms and girls were in casual/play clothes. Matt asked why the girls had no uniforms like our opponent, St. John Vianney. I had no answer but three weeks later at our Diablo League Championship Meet our entire girls team – 65 strong – competed in new uniforms because of our first sponsorship check from Matt. The program is in its 41st Season.

Matt took over the dealership in 1979 and continued the "Mazzei Way" by assisting local programs. His daughter Angela and Son Matthew arrived in 1982 and 1984 and started swimming for Dana Hills Swim Team in 1987. Matt, annoyed with the little 20-yard, 6-lane Cabana Club pool and average swim results for 2 seasons, had an idea! With his father, many parents and Steve Gonsalves at his side, he redesigned and rebuilt the mini Dana Hills pool into a first class 8-lane Swim Complex. The transition propelled the Otters' Swimmers to improved times by every swimmer, quadrupled their county times. Invitational Meet

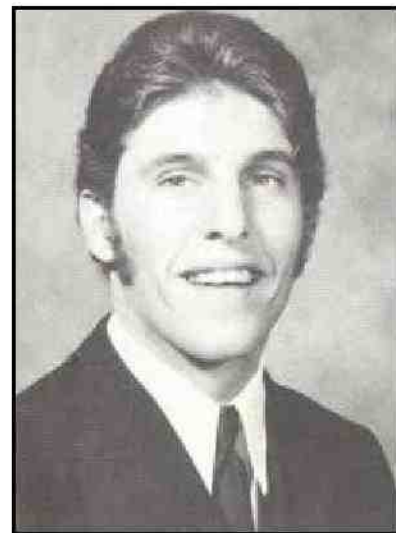
success, started the annual Penthalon won 22 of 23 Swim Championships and enriched the lives of every connected family. Numerous local prep, collegiate aquatic athletes and one Olympic Medalist can directly trace their success to the Dana Hills facility Matt changed.

Matt has participated in every conceivable fundraiser: CVHS Golf Tournaments, Poker and Casino Nights, CV Booster Club Crab Feeds, the Clayton Theater Company, and if a youngster asked him to buy and candy bar or merchant card to sponsor their team he'd buy five, according to longtime friend Chris Branich.

When daughter Angela '01 and Matthew '03 entered CVHS his focus sharpened. Matt helped Mr. Bledsoe and the Water Polo program, with the help of Debra Gonsalves started the FB Team Homecoming Breakfast, replaced every basket/backboard in the Large Gym and began to assist the baseball program led by Bob Ralston. By 2000 with the help of parents and Steve Gonsalves, he transformed the baseball field to a Bay Area Best Baseball Complex, equipped with a new fence, scoreboard, dugouts storage sheds, proper irrigation, bullpens and a new infield.

New with the same support group and new "state-of-the-art" batting cage was completed in 2004 with up to 4 hitting tunnels, storage shed and space to train, a perfect amenity for rainy days. A coaches and players dream come true! Since 1999 our baseball program has enjoyed a great deal of success and is considered one of the best in Northern California. Matt joins fellow CVHS Alumni Mike and Lauri Rose and Steve and Debra Gonsalves into our Hall of Fame for their community passion. "Be True to Your School" exemplifies their spirit. Thank you, Matt.

# GARY GARDNER



**G**ary Gardner's name is synonymous with CVHS volleyball, having been part of the program in some capacity off and on from 1975 to 1999.

He was the head coach of the girls volleyball program from 1976-79. He also was the head volleyball coach for the boys volleyball program from 1987-1988.

Having played at UC Santa Barbara, Gary graduated in 1973 and went to Upper Volta (now Burkina Faso) Africa as a Peace Corp volunteer to teach. While there, he was given an additional opportunity to coach the national volleyball team with his Voltaique co-coach.

Upon returning from Africa, his coaching talents were requested as a replacement assistant coach at CVHS for the balance of the 1975 season. He was hired in 1976 as the head coach, beginning his successful contribution to the CVHS girls volleyball program.

Previously inducted in 2008, the 1976 team was the DVAL Champion and the first ever North Coast Section girls champion.

This year's inductee is the 1977 team. Their success was a carbon copy of their predecessor's winning the DVAL and the NCS championship for the second year in a row. During the two preceding years, Gary had been working with other likeminded coaches to create a postseason State Invitational Tournament for California's Section winners. The tournament was held in Bakersfield. Although invited, CVHS was disappointed to be denied permission to participate by the NCS. This inaugural event paved the way for the first State Championship in 1979, when CVHS participated as the NCS representative.

The 1978 team impressively won the DVAL again, but fell short of winning the NCS championship for the third consecutive year.

In his final year as the girls coach, the 1979 team won the DVAL for a fourth consecutive year and amazingly won the third NCS championship in four years.

After the 1979 season Gary continued to support the volleyball program as a part time assistant and clinician, but chose to shift his focus to being a husband, father and business owner.

Starting in the mid-80s, Gary campaigned for a new spring sport, Boys Volleyball. In 1987 Gary became the first Boys volleyball coach at CVHS, where he coached for two seasons.

Gary didn't return to coach at CVHS for a decade. He came back to help the coaching staff of the 98/99 teams to success with the 1999 team. This team qualified for the NCS championship for the first time the 1979 win of the NCS title.

Besides his many stints at CVHS, Gary was actively coaching high school, club and college throughout the East Bay until his final season in 2003.

In closing Gary, wants you to know that he is proud of the athletes who played for CVHS, some of whom went on to play in college and some who came back to coach at CVHS and other schools and clubs. He is also looking forward to seeing faces that he has not seen in a long, long time!

The stage had been set for a successful 1967 season by the accomplishments of the 1966 team. The '66 team was undefeated in dual match competition winning (14) straight matches. This meant a Diablo Valley Athletic League dual match title that was topped off by a 1st place finish at the league tournament. The league tournament saw eleven CVHS place finishers, including DVAL champs Rick Beberg ('67) and Dean Balough ('66). The margin of victory was an impressive twenty-two points over 2nd place finisher and rival College Park.

Needless to say, the '67 team was loaded with talent going into the next season returning eight varsity wrestlers in thirteen weight classes. With the addition of newcomers, this is a season that saw the team continue their dual meet domination - winning (15) straight dual matches. This gave the team an overall (30) dual match win streak that dated back to the end of the 1965 season. In tournament competition the team also was dominant. They started out by winning the prestigious Del Valle Invitational Tournament, a (16) team tournament with top teams from all over Northern California. The tournament produced six Eagle place finishers including champions Doug Balough ('69) at 97 lbs, Derrell Hoschouer ('67) at 129 lbs and Lancer Smith ('67) at 167 lbs. Lancer's victory at 167 was especially impressive for the universally popular wrestler who had only started his career one year prior.

The team's dominance continued to a DVAL dual match title when they defeated arch rival College Park in a 26 - 23 victory on CP's home mat. This season also included a throttling of the Concord High School team that was in their first year of existence. It wasn't pretty and the woefully undermanned Minutemen took a 52-2 defeat - but finished with their heads up. Other traditional wrestling powerhouses such as Pittsburg High School and Pacifica High School also went down to defeat at the hands of the Eagle juggernaut.

The 1967 DVAL Tournament saw the team destroy the competition scoring a massive (134) points with no other team reaching (100) points. The team again saw eleven place winners, but this time it included five DVAL Champions: Doug Balough ('69) at 98 lbs., Rick Beberg ('67) at 106 lbs., Dave DuBois ('67) at 115 lbs., Derrell Hoschouer ('67) at 130 lbs and Lancer Smith ('67) at 168 lbs. The team also saw three 2nd place finishers as well as one 3rd and two 4th place finishers. Note that for the second straight year, Rick Beberg wrestled Pat Martucci ('68) in the championship finals - two individuals from the same school in the finals of a nine team tournament is something you don't see anymore and speaks to the strength of the team.

The next week was February 18th, 1967 where the team won Clayton Valley's first North Coast Section Wrestling Championship at Granada High School (Livermore, CA) scoring a team total of (63) points. Again, College Park was the runner-up, a good indicator of the strength of the DVAL in a tournament that hosted six leagues and fifty-six teams. CVHS had five place winners, including

champions Balough and Hoschouer along with 2nd place finishers Beberg and DuBois. Lancer Smith finished in 3rd place and qualified for the North State Tournament the following week.

At the State Tournament in Sacramento, CVHS had an impressive 2nd place team finish in a tournament that represented approximately (315) high schools - one of the largest State Tournaments in the nation. All five CVHS representatives scored points for the team, that was led by Derrell Hoschouer, who became Clayton Valley's 3rd State Champion since the school opened in 1958. Rick Beberg took 2nd place for the 2nd straight year. Lancer Smith won a 4th place medal. A superior showing for a team that had been driven hard all year and produced achievements worthy of their dedication.

#### Comments on Coach Zino:

From Pat Martucci: Who later was the first head coach of the De La Salle wrestling program.

"Coach Zino placed emphasis on strength, conditioning - and wrestling basics. He taught pages one, two and three of the Wrestling 101 Handbook - that's all you needed to win championships."

From Doug Balough:

"Coach Zino had the team run five miles before practice started, worked us for two and a half hours and then ran us ragged doing exercises at the end of practice. And again, more running around the Girls Gym at 6:00pm at night. I remember him shouting at Beberg when he would steal a drink from the water fountain. More than once he told me to go to my locker and pack-up my stuff and leave if I didn't like it. In the end, that was a winning formula."

From Derrell Hoschouer

"What can you say about a team that went over two years undefeated. We were focused, determined and extremely well coached! Personally, I was amazed to be in the midst of such a great team. People I looked up to were all around me. To have a coach of Z's abilities, drive and caring was a pure blessing. That season was a true turning point in my life."

From Bill Nelson, 1967 Pittsburg High School wrestling coach and future longtime CVHS teacher, coach and Athletic Director:

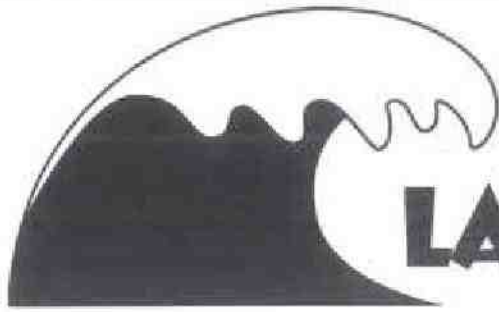
