

BIALE'S CELEBRATE 100 YEARS IN FOOD & HOSPITALITY BUSINESS

This year, 2022 . marks 100 YEARS for the Biale Family in the food and hospitality industry!

After my grandparents, Giovanni and Virginia Biale , immigrated from Italy , they opened Biale's Meat Market on Potrero Hill, the Italian neighborhood in San Francisco . In fact , BIALE, is still tiled into the entry way on Connecticut Street to this day.

Giovanni and Virginia, owned and operated Biale's Meat Market from 1922 to 1962. By the way, they lived upstairs from the Meat Market, not too bad of a commute! Their three sons, Giacomo (Jack), Mario (my father) and Rudy also worked at the Meat Market. Jack stayed in the butcher business his whole life, owning and operating his own Meat Markets in San Francisco.

My Dad went to work at the original Bimbo's 365 Club on Market St (yes , 365 Market...that's how it got the name). Augustino " Bimbo" Giuntoli and my dad were lifelong friends.

Beginning in the 1940's , my Dad went on to own and operate The Carnival Club on Eddy St , The Shadow Box in Laurel Heights , then he and his brother Rudy , opened Don & Rudy's at California & Hyde. Don was a nickname for my dad, don't ask.

Rudy opened Between the Acts on Geary St in San Francisco's theatre district, before moving to Phoenix and opened many bars and restaurants, Guys and Dolls was an extremely popular nightclub in the 1950's.

My uncle, Rudy Biale, went to great success after moving to Hawaii in the 1960's. He owned and operated many successful restaurants and bars, namely Rudy's Italian Restaurant in Waikiki for 26 years. My brother Anthony and I worked for Rudy while living in Hawaii in the 1980's.

In 1960, My dad went back to work for Bimbo's, now located on Columbus in San Francisco, where he stayed until retiredOr so we thought. Soon after retirement he was lured back to work at Petar's in Lafayette in the early 1970's. He met Petar Jakovina when they both worked Bimbo's in the early 1960's.

As for myself, after working at many bars and restaurants in Contra Costa from the mid 1970's to late 1990's , my family took a chance and opened Rocco's Ristorante & Pizzeria in October 1999, on Halloween to be specific.

All three of our grown kids work at Rocco's now, Dante behind the bar, Dominic at the front desk and Nina serving on the floor.

So there you have it , a brief look at 100 Years for the Biale Family in the Food, Spirit and Hospitality Business . On behalf of loving grandparents, who were also married for 75 year years , my parents and uncles, my family wants to thank you for 100 years of your support and friendship!



Clayton Business and Community Association (CBCA)

In 1984 a group of concerned business owners and community members founded the Clayton Business and Professional Association to help further the businesses of Clayton. They quickly realized that their cause had to expand beyond just businesses to benefit the entire Clayton community. Thus, the organization's name was changed to the Clayton Business and Community Association (CBCA).

Today, the CBCA is a non-sectarian, non-partisan, non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, independent of the City of Clayton, comprised of Clayton residents, business entities, and those wishing to voluntarily serve the Clayton community.

The CBCA is solely responsible for organizing and producing the major festivals in Clayton each year. The CBCA Art & Wine Festival began in 1995 and started the CBCA tradition of transforming Clayton into a "festival destination city."

Following the CBCA Art & Wine Festival, came the CBCA Oktoberfest and the addition of the CBCA BBQ & Brews Festival as well as the advent of the CBCA Clayton Bocce League and facility.

Thousands of Claytonians and visitors alike flock to downtown Clayton each year to delight in the charms of our town, our businesses, beautiful surroundings, and friendly festival-like atmosphere. In addition to festival goers, over 1800 bocce players from all over the Bay Area now participate in the CBCA Clayton Bocce leagues throughout the year. A Cornhole league is slated to begin soon as well.

Proceeds from CBCA festivals, CBCA Clayton Bocce, and other fundraising efforts are donated to a variety of causes, organizations, groups, and charities benefiting the Clayton community.

Some that have received CBCA donations are; Clayton Valley Village, Diamond Terrace, Clayton Valley Little League, Blue Star Moms, Clayton AAUW, Clayton Valley VFW, Mt Diablo Elementary school, including helping to rebuild the school playground, Diablo View Middle School, Dana Hills Swim Team, Junior Achievement, Christmas for Everyone, Diablo Vista Soroptimists, Adopt-a-family, Grants to Clayton businesses during the pandemic, the Clayton Community Library, Clayton Historical Society, Clayton Theatre Company, and nearly \$300,000 in scholarships, just to name a few.

In addition to scholarships, the CBCA is proud to be an ongoing sponsor of CVCHS athletics, as well as various CVCHS educational opportunities.

Furthermore, during the past 10 years alone, over \$102,000 has gone directly to the City of Clayton for things such as, new computers at city hall, police car repairs, a new staff picnic table outside of city hall, city hall plumbing repairs, Clayton CERT, the downtown Christmas decorations, citywide beautification projects, sponsorship of the Clayton 4th of July Parade, including the volunteers it takes to put on that parade, and over \$45,000 to the Concerts in the Grove. Plus, CBCA donations built the Grove Gazebo, widely considered to be the centerpiece of downtown Clayton.

This year, the CBCA has earmarked \$175,000 to donate back to the Clayton community.

CBCA is honored to accept the CVCHS Athletic Hall of Fame Award as we continue our mission to support and benefit the greater Clayton community.

Dee Billeter Athletic Director/Coach

At 27 years, Dee Billeter is the longest-serving Athletic Director—boys or girls—in Clayton Valley history. Her lifelong fight for women's equality made a lasting impact on girl's athletics not only at Clayton Valley, but throughout the North Coast Section. Dee's dedication to Clayton Valley is unparalleled, as evidenced by her years as a decorated teacher, coach, athletic director, CV parent, CV grandparent, and cofounder of the CV Athletic Hall of Fame.

Dee grew up in Portland, Oregon, in a sports-minded family with three siblings. In middle school, Dee played CYO volleyball, basketball, and softball. Although Portland high schools in the late 1950's did not offer interscholastic sports for girls, Dee competed in her high school's volleyball and basketball intramural programs.

When Dee went on to the University of Portland, there were only two sports for women: basketball and tennis. Dee played on the very successful basketball team that went undefeated in Dee's junior year. Dee graduated in 1964 with a major in Physical Education and a minor in French. She earned her MA in Physical Education in 1968 from SF State University.

Just before starting at CVHS in 1966, Dee married her late husband Tom who was a dedicated teacher and coach. Throughout their 54 years together Tom's love, encouragement, enthusiastic support and great sense of humor were Dee's anchor and inspiration.

In 1966, the girls' athletic program in the district was limited to occasional Girls Athletic Association (GAA) "play days" with schools in the area. Dee, along with 2008 Hall of Fame inductee Karen Johnson and other like-minded women coaches, started the journey on the path to more equity. Even with the implementation of Title IX in 1972, advances did not come easily. However, the success and scope of CV's girls' athletic program over the years is a testament to the dedication of those early pioneers.

From 1966 to 1970, Dee coached JV Field Hockey, JV Basketball and Varsity Gymnastics and assisted with other sports. In 1971, she took a maternity leave of absence. She returned to teaching part-time in 1973 and coached the Varsity Softball team from 1974 to 1976, winning the League Championship in 1975 and 1976 (there was no girl's North Coast Section yet).

She also coached the co-ed bowling team from 2000 to 2003.

Dee was the girl's athletic director from 1976 to 2003. She oversaw many Leagues and NCS championship wins for CV girls' teams, including the State championship in Cross Country. However, although the wins were great, Dee's greatest success is measured by the number of competition opportunities she helped to create for so many girls for so many years at every level.

In 2008, Dee and former boys' athletic director Bill Nelson, created and co-chaired the CV Athletic Hall of Fame committee. With the help and support of many, the first induction was held in 2008 and Dee's work on the committee continues to this day.

Both Dee and Tom's children and three of their grandchildren are CV graduates with the fourth to graduate next year. All have benefited from their participation in athletics at CV. Go Eagles!!

<u>The 1985 Football Team</u>

The 1985 Head Coach, George Smylie led Clayton Valley High School varsity football team to one of the all-time great seasons in Clayton Valley history. Winning the DVAL title with a regular season record of 9-1, the Ugly Eagles squad tore through the preseason undefeated and with a single loss in league play and the title in hand, were well prepared for a North Coast playoff run.

The Varsity Football team gave

Jeff Badger's bruising running style put him over 1,000 yards for the season and earned him the accolade DVAL Player of the Year. Contrasting Badger's running style, Ronaldo Bussey brought a change of pace at running back with his speed and quickness. Both running backs benefited from a powerful Mike Huff coached offensive line anchored by Gary Ferguson, Rob Dorsey, and Anthony Wilson. Three year starting guarterback Chris Katsulares, who would later go on to UCLA and backup Hall of Famer Troy Aikman, was efficient all season finding All DVAL wide receiver Keith Ellis and UC Davis bound tight end Ken Murray consistently for big gains. Leo Rowland, who later went on to kick for DVC and become a JUCO All-American who received a scholarship to kick at Brown University, won two key games for the Ugly Eagles in the final moments. A last second 47-yard field goal against Ygnacio Valley to secure the win was a precursor to one of the most exciting finishes in NCS history.

After defeating De Anza 28-19 in the first round of the NCS playoffs, Clayton Valley faced traditional powerhouse San Ramon Valley on a muddy field that many would go on to say was "unplayable" and in a condition that would most likely cause the venue to be changed in this current age of athletics. With the score locked at 7-7 after regulation, the game went into overtime. Rowland kicked a field goal to put the Uglies up 10-7 after holder Jeff Olson handled the snap and muddy football perfectly. The vaunted Ugly Eagle defense, led by Defensive Coordinator Bill Mattson, lived up to its nickname as Greg Svitenko, Gino Colchico, Chad Linderman, Chris Ellis, and Gary Gissel all rallied for a goal line stand to stop San Ramon and send Clayton Valley into the NCS Championship in the Oakland Coliseum. Though falling to Pittsurg 15-12 in the NCS finals, the 1985 Clayton Valley varsity team ended the season as DVAL League Champions and also earned the title of North Coast Section Area Champions for their 2-0 ride through their side of the NCS bracket. They finished the season with an admirable 11-2 record. This tough-nosed football team will be remembered for continuing the tradition of Ugly Eagle football: strong defense, tough players, a pounding run game, and a never-quit attitude.

<u>1996 Girl's Track Team</u>



The 1996 varsity girls track team accomplished a record that had never been achieved in the history of CVHS. They became the 8th track team in a row to go undefeated in league competition. They were 6-0 in the League in 1996. John Millar was the coach, and he holds the head coaching record for the Most Consecutive League Championships in any sport at Clayton Valley.

Kelly Howisey & Pia McAlllister were the most valuable players on the team and Alisa Macksey was the team captain. The Top Sprinter was Pia McAllister, Top Field event competitor was Dana Lawson, Top Distance runner was Heather Wallace & Kelly Howisey. The team took 2nd place at NCS. Kelly, Deborah, and Heather were part of the 1994 State Championship Cross Country team inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2013.

Four members of this team went on to compete at the college level, three in Division I Dana Lawson (Cal Berkeley), Kelly Howisey (Vanderbilt), Deborah Osteen (Nebraska) and one at a Division II school Heather Wallace (Seattle Pacific).

Not only was this a great championship team, but they were also scholars. Their accumulative GPA was third in the North Coast Section.

This was accomplished during a very wet year when running on a soft track and in mud was accepted as the norm. The only all-weather track in our league was Alhambra. Even though the track was soft, wet, and muddy on which to train, this team set 5 school records and almost two more. Holes were dug in the track for pumps to help remove the water.

Twenty-foot boards were pulled by many hands to scrape off the mud. The jumping pits were lakes even with such conditions this team excelled.



The boy's baseball team had the best season in the history of Clayton Valley, finishing with a league record of 14-0 lead by head coach Bob Johnson, assistant coach Eric Lund, and manager Mike Hamilton.

The team was led by seniors Kip Yaughn, Damon Mashore, and Pat Tozier. Kip pitched a perfect game vs Northgate, two no-hitters and four one hitters this season. Damon Mashore led the team in stolen bases and homeruns with 8. Pat Tozier, who batted in the DH spot or played at third base, had a .419 batting average with 5 homeruns. Some other big names on the field were Kevin Collins in left field who made second team All-DVAL along with first baseman Bryson Web. Damon, Kip, Pat made the All-DVAL 1st team. The team captains were Damon Mashore, Kip Yaughn, and Mike Aguiar. Most improved was Bryson Webb, and the most valuable players were Damon and Kip.

In 1988, the team still had the best win/loss record 22-5, most wins 22, and most homeruns 17. They also played in the Diablo Valley Easter Tournament 1st place.

Damon Mashore and Pat Tozier went to play in Major League Baseball (MLB) for the Oakland A's and Kip for the Baltimore Orioles and Florida Marlins. Justin Mashore and Lance Daniels played professional baseball in the Minor (University of Oklahoma), Damon (University of Arizona) and Kip (Arizona State University) all attended major colleges and played baseball.

After finishing 5-1 in 1974 and 6-2 in 1975 in Diablo Valley Athletic League (DVAL) competition, the 1976 Girls Gymnastics Team finished second in the DVAL with a 7-1 record. The Ugly Eagles led by Head Coach Patricia Potter and Asst. Coach Terry Turner, went into the DVAL post-season with confidence in competing at a high level. Indeed, Terri Markey (Jr.) won the All-Around Championship in the Intermediate Optionals Division. In the Beginner Division, Charli Patterson (Jr.) won the All-Around Championship. Andrea Eissner (So.) finished 2nd in the Beginner Division All-Around. In all, Clayton Valley won nine 1st place awards, five 2nd, two 3rd, and one 5th place. Although no team scores were kept for post-season meets, the top 5 individual placers in each division advanced to the North Coast Section (NCS) Championship.

Two weeks later, teams representing ten different NCS leagues were at the inaugural NCS Girls Gymnastics Championships. Clayton Valley continued to perform exceptionally well, with Terri Markey becoming an NCS Champion in All-Around in the Intermediate Optionals Division. Charli Patterson won the NCS Championship in the All-Around in the Beginner Division while teammate Andrea Eissner was 2nd. The Eagles won eight 1st place awards, one 2nd, four 3rd, and one 5th place. At team awards, Terri Markey was named team MVP while Valerie Thomason and Denise Priest received the Outstanding Senior Award. Terri Markey was awarded the highly respected Fitzpatrick Super Sport Award for her DVAL and NCS performance.

The 1977 Girls Gymnastics Team went undefeated in DVAL competition at 8-0, winning their second League title in 4 years (1974 first title). At the DVAL Meet, Laura Landgraf (Sr.) was crowned League Champion in the coveted All-Around Intermediate Compulsory Division while Ellen Emes (Fr.) finished 4th. Charli Patterson (Sr.) won the League Championship in the All-Around in the Intermediate Optionals Division. Clayton Valley won seven 1st places, one 2nd, one 3rd, three 4th, and three 5th places.

The 2nd Annual NCS Girls Gymnastics Championship saw Laura Landgraf earning an NCS Championship in the All-Around in the Intermediate Compulsory Division, while Charli Patterson was crowned NCS Champion by winning the All-Around competition in the Intermediate Optionals Division. The Eagles won seven 1st place awards. At team awards, Ellen Emes was named MVP while Laura Landgraf and Charli Patterson received the Outstanding Senior Award. Laura Landgraf was awarded the Fitzpatrick Super Sport Award for her DVAL and NCS performance.

The 1976 and 1977 Girls Gymnastics Team helped establish Clayton Valley as one of the premier Girls Gymnastics programs in the North Coast Section. They are honored here as great examples of Eagle pride and poise.

Interestingly, Charli Patterson, as of 2018 (last time the Top-Ten Swimming and Diving Records Board was updated), is ranked #9 All-Time in CVHS Diving Scores under the *Boys* listing. In 1977, the Boys and Girls Diving Events were combined. She is listed as "Charlie Patterson" on the Board.


