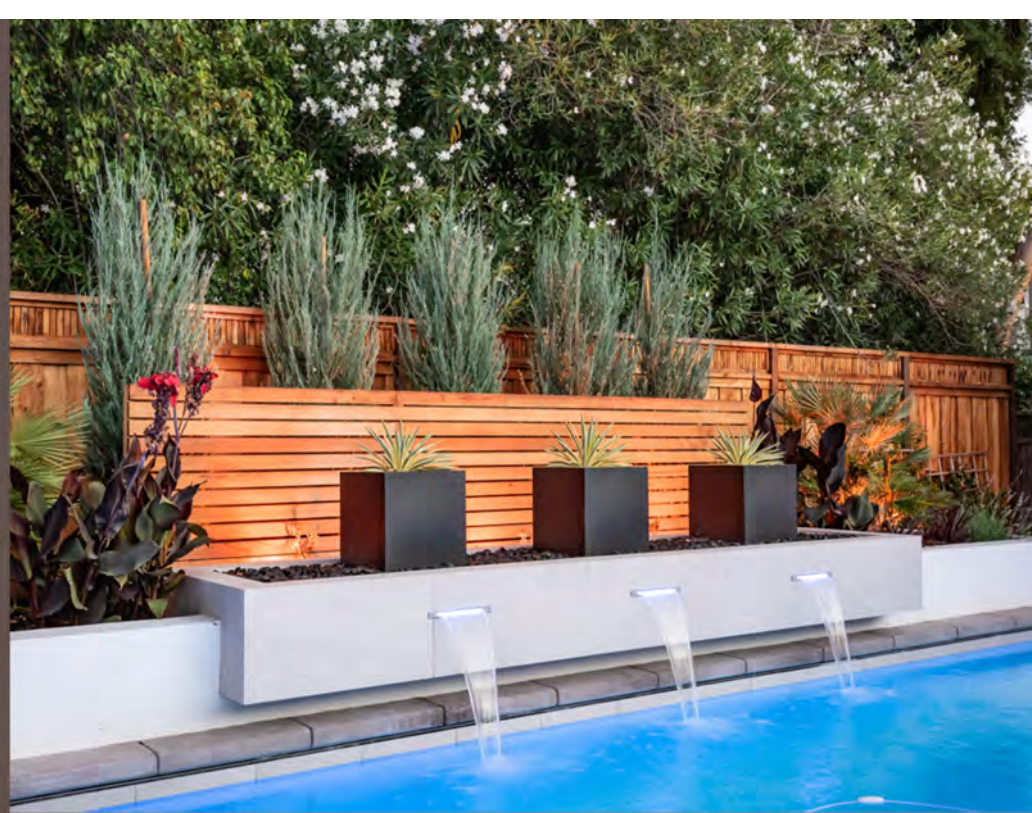

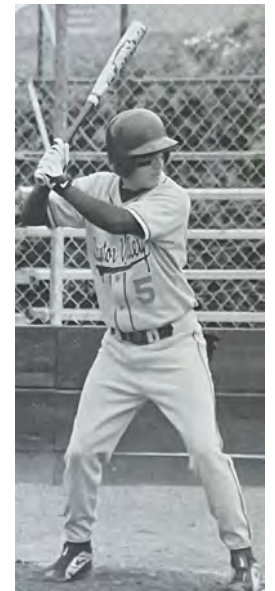

The 2002 Eagles were the first CVHS baseball team to play in the Oakland Coliseum for the NCS 3A East Bay Championship. The Eagles led with the pitching duo of Adam Elliot and Jason Meredith, a superb defense and clutch hitting beat Arroyo 4-1, Foothill 3-0 and ACAL Champion Berkeley 10-1 to advance to the Coliseum vs Newark Memorial. As fate would have it, the Eagles fell short losing 12-7.

The Eagles were led by head coach Bob Ralston, his right-hand man Casey Coakley and assistants Mark Reed, the late John Coover and Mark Mullinberg. As Bay Valley Athletic League Champions, the Eagles took down local powers Deer Valley, De La Salle and Antioch.

"I watched lots of Clayton Valley games from that era. The '02 team was aggressive, always putting pressure on the opponent and they were especially tough at home. Fun team to cover." As Joe Stiglich- CC Times Sports writer remembered.

Clayton Valley baseball takes great pride in the outstanding tradition that has developed since the school opened in 1958. Our program has achieved a highly respected reputation in Northern California through the hard work of many players, coaches, families and community members throughout the decades. Our alumni are very proud.

"That was a bad ass team!" as quoted by Matt Mazzei Jr. were led by Adam Elliot, drafted by the NY Mets, and the Contra Costa Times "Player of the Year" and 1st team SS Jeff Landry, who scored an amazing school record of 50 runs! Sam Ray All CC Times 3rd Team (1B) and pitcher Jason Meredith who sported an 8-1 record were excellent. Landry, Ray and Meredith were juniors.

Defensive whiz, Junior Matt Mazzei (3B) and Sophomore Matt Reed (OF) were named 2nd Team All BVAL. Chris Proehl/ SR. catcher was Honorable Mention. Elliot and Landry were selected All ANG (Alameda News Group) "Best of the Best" Adam Elliot capped his Sr. year on the 2002 Cal-Hi Sports All State Baseball Team. The team 22-6 ended their season as Cal-Hi Sports #8 ranked team in Northern California.

Other standouts include 2nd Baseman Dale Swinford, Centerfielder Jason Ebeling, Right fielder Geof Byrns, Catcher Chris Salmon, Pitchers; Jeff Choate, Jimmy Gilbert, Joe Stoiber and outfielders; Mark Mullaney, Jason Salmon and Bandon Zenuk.

Besides the Team's success, the Matt Mazzei Baseball complex was built. The stadium was renovated, and the Hitting complex was designed and built by Matt Mazzei with the help from many parents in the program and community support. The hitting complex is one of the best in California and has given countless Ugly Eagles players the best training facility to develop their Baseball Skills.

The 1997 Eagle Football Team behind Sam Williams and Brian Foreman, DI scholarship athletes and a host of outstanding seniors set the table for "One of the Best" football teams in our school's history. First winning season in almost a decade, BVAL runner-up and a trip to the NCS semi-finals. Eight underclassmen started.

The 1998 team opened with a 27-27 tie at Vacaville. The stunned Eagles then dominated the BVAL in route to the school's fourth league title (1974-1975-1985) since the school opened in 1958.

The final BVAL game (featured live on Bay TV) vs. Ygnacio Valley at Mt. Diablo High School was an ELITE showdown between two undefeated league teams. YV was the top scoring team in Northern California. The game was played to a standing room only crowd. Close to 5,000 fans packed Red Devil Stadium. After a 7-7 tie in regulation, the game continued in overtime. The Eagles prevailed 14-7 behind a rock solid defensive led by Jerry Coakley. Hysteria followed as students, alumni, fans and parents raced on the field to CELEBRATE.

Two NCS 3A East Bay opening victories over San Ramon Valley 43-21 and over Amador Valley 6-0 moved the club to championship game vs. Bishop O'Dowd. Unfortunately, with rain most of the week a soaked field at Mt. Diablo High School and a plea to move the game to DVC Saturday. The result Friday night was a torrential downpour during Roxanne Pardi's National Anthem. Many spectators fled to their cars and when turn-overs outnumbered points, the result was a 10-0 loss. BVAL record 8-0 overall record 10-2-1. The Eagles set a school record 2,407 rushing yds. and their 65 pts. vs. Northgate, 365 pts. in a season and 4,075 total yds. ranks second behind the 1997 Team in school history. The three-year journey to reach the NCS Championship was amazing. Remember, our seniors as freshman did not win a football game. The players bought into a new system and were guided by some of the best coaches I have ever been associated with. Jerry Coakley, David Jeans, Rick Norwood, Clyde Foreman, Mike Gorman and John Canesa. Our administration led by first year principal John Neary, the CVHS Faculty, our student body and most importantly our parents were a "Gold Medal" Support staff. We coached the team hard, and they responded.

Mikey Hamilton Team Manager

In Loving memory: February 20, 1975 - February 9, 2018

Mikey Hamilton's family lived in a home just over the fence from Clayton Valley's tennis courts. Mikey was not able to attend CV because the special classes he needed were not offered there. He went to Concord High and found another way to become a true and awesome Eagle!



Mikey was born with Prader Willis syndrome which is caused by a chromosome defect. He was limited physically but even at a young age he participated in sports. Mikey competed in the Special Olympics program in track and basketball. He also participated in bowling and the Challenger baseball league.

In 1986, Mike arrived at the Clayton Valley coach's office. He met Bob Johnson who was then the Frosh football coach. Mikey talked to Bob about volunteering to help the team and it was the beginning of a very long and close relationship. Mikey was with Bob as he went on to coach J.V. basketball and Varsity baseball. Mikey continued to serve as Team Manager for those three sports for many years and worked very successfully with all CV coaches. Herc Pardi became CV's Head Varsity Football coach in 1996. According to Coach Pardi "Mikey was amazing as a volunteer and really made our lives easier as coaches. The players absolutely LOVED him". When Coach Johnson later began coaching golf, Mikey was there to assist him again. He continued to be an important asset to our athletic programs until 2001 when his health issues made it too difficult to continue.

The coaches and athletes with whom Mikey worked found him to be reliable, enthusiastic, respectful, and inspiring. He didn't want special treatment and wanted to be just one of the boys. The athletes on those teams were grateful to Mikey and bonded with him. The 1988 league champion baseball team wanted to honor Mikey that year for his contributions to the program. At the baseball awards night, they presented him with his CV letterman jacket. The picture here shows how happy and proud Mikey was to wear the symbol of his accomplishments!

Mikey's parents, Loni and Steve Hamilton and sisters Julia and Denise are all Clayton Valley graduates. Loni and Steve were devoted parents who gave their love and care to Mikey throughout his life. Steve was with Mikey at most every athletic contest over the years. The family greatly appreciates Bob Johnson for taking Mikey under his wing and helping him to become part of the Eagle family. 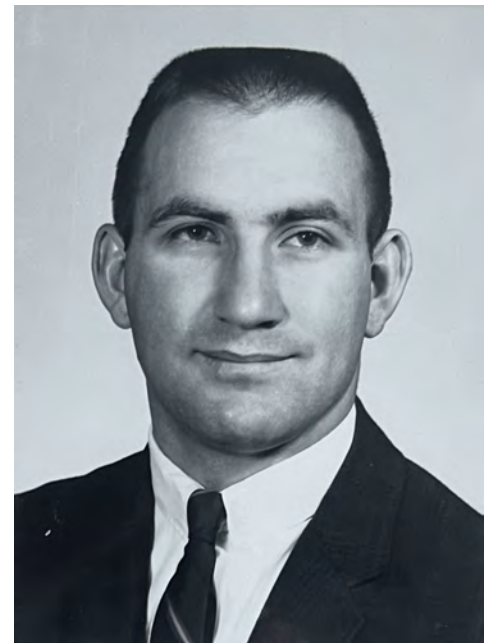

Bill Nelson Athletic Director/Coach



Bill Nelson's family moved to Concord in 1953 where Bill attended Loma Vista Middle School and then Mt. Diablo High school. Bill's first organized sport was Freshman football at Mt. Diablo where his coach was the late Bruce Iverson. Bill now joins Iverson, a long-time teacher, coach and Athletic Director at Clayton Valley as an honored member of our Hall of Fame.

Bill played four years of football at Mt. Diablo. The team won the league championships in 1958 and again in 1959 when Bill was the team captain. Bill also ran Track for four years and was named Most Valuable on the Track team in 1960. Bill wrestled for two years and earned two letters in each of three sports, winning the PJ Kramer, Athlete of the Year Award, his senior year. In his spare time, he served as the Junior class president. Bill was awarded a football scholarship to Brigham Young University where he played for four years. From his sophomore year through his senior year, Bill was the starting fullback for BYU and was named Honorable Mention All-League his sophomore season. In his junior season he demonstrated his team commitment and grit, playing all 60 minutes of one game, and he was selected team captain his senior season. Graduating from BYU in 1965, with a teaching credential and an MA in Recreation, Bill began teaching at Pittsburg High School. He taught Physical Education and Driver's Training, coached JV Football, and was the Head Wrestling coach. Bill remembers coaching against then-CV coaches Tom DiMercurio, Larry Fogelstrom, and Roger Zino who would soon become colleagues.

In 1967, Principal Dan Della hired Bill to teach at Clayton Valley and to coach Freshman Football with Bob Royster and assisted Mike Miramonte in Track. In his 34 years at Clayton Valley, Bill taught Physical Education, served as department chairman and coached at all levels in the Football and Wrestling



programs. In 1975, Bill was an assistant on the Varsity football team under Head coach Roger Zino. That year the team won the DVAL league championship for the second consecutive year and went on to the first ever sectional NCS playoffs.

In 1972, Bill was an assistant to Head Wrestling coach Glen Scrimger. That year, the team won the DVAL and North Coast Championships. Glen retired from coaching and Bill became the Head coach from 1974-1976. Bill was honored as the Fitzpatrick Super Sport Wrestling Coach of the year in 1976. When Pacifica High School in West Pittsburg was closing in 1977, Bill offered to give up his Head coach position so that Pacifica's wrestling coach, Bill Smith, could take his job. Bill was Smith's assistant the next year as the team dominated the league, the NCS, and won the 1977 California CIF state Wrestling Championship!

In 1991, after Bruce Iverson's retirement, Bill became Athletic Director. In his 34 years at CV Bill consistently encouraged and inspired his students and athletes and was respected by fellow coaches and A.D.s for his competence and integrity. He influenced all with his dedication, hard work, and positive good nature. He exemplifies the special spirit and heart of a true Eagle!

Bill married fellow Clayton Valley teacher Terry Turner forty-seven years ago. Their three children are all CVHS graduates, and they have been blessed with six grandchildren.

Bill retired from CVHS in 2003 and in 2008, then-A.D. Pat Middendorf asked Bill and retired girl's A.D., Dee Billeter, to found the Clayton Valley Athletic Hall of Fame. As we celebrate another induction, we are thankful that another of Bill's legacies continues, and we happily congratulate him tonight!
